**AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Clams in Cobscook River in the
Township of Edmunds.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1949, c. 62, amended. The 1st paragraph of chapter 62 of the private and special laws of 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'It shall be unlawful ~~between the 21st day of September, 1949 and until the 20th day of September, 1951~~ **1953, both days inclusive** for any person to dig or take more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any 1 day from all the shores or flats of the Cobscook river southerly of a line drawn from Gravel Point in the ~~town~~ **township** of Edmunds to Leighton Point in the ~~town~~ **township** of Trescott.'
