AN ACT to Amend the Charter of Continental Mills.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1865, c. 448, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 448 of the private and special laws of 1865, as amended by chapter 60 of the private and special laws of 1875, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Powers. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture in Lewiston, Maine, cotton, wool, and flax in the city of Lewiston, rayon, nylon and any other natural, artificial and synthetic fibres and materials and any combination, blend or mixture of any of them, textile fabrics, cloth, and any products which may be derived by or in the course of such manufacture; to buy, sell and otherwise deal in textile fabrics and cloth, and natural, artificial and synthetic fibres and materials, and any products which may be derived by or in the course of manufacturing as above authorized; to purchase, and hold and have any real and personal estate ~~not exceeding in value fifteen hundred thousand dollars~~ necessary or convenient for its business; to build and erect or otherwise acquire such buildings and machinery as ~~their~~ the convenience of its business may require, and make ~~all such necessary~~ bylaws, rules and regulations for the prosecution of the same as may be consistent with the laws of the state of Maine.'
