STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Definition of "Dealer" in Sale of Milk.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 80, amended. The 1st sentence of section 80 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Any person, firm, corporation, association or society, who shall sell or deliver milk or cream as a business to any person from a wagon or other conveyance, depot, or store or any structure, or who shall sell or deliver milk to a hotel, restaurant, boarding-house or any public place, shall be considered a milk dealer within the meaning of this section, and shall on or before the 1st day of January in each year, apply to the commissioner for registration, furnishing such information as may be required, upon blanks issued and furnished by the said commissioner to such persons as may request the same.'
