AN ACT Relating to Tuition High School Pupils in Mechanic Falls.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1893, c. 559, § 5, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 5 of chapter 550 of the private and special laws of 1893 is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Scholars from the towns of Minot and Poland shall be admitted to the high school of Mechanic Falls on the same terms and subject to the same regulations as scholars residing in the town of Mechanic Falls, except that the town of Mechanic Falls shall be entitled to charge tuition therefor as provided by the general law; provided, however, that should said high school become overcrowded by reason of such attendance, the superintending school committee may exclude such scholars not residing in said town of Mechanic Falls as it may deem for the best interests of said school.'
