**AN ACT Assenting to Act of Congress Relating to Fish Restoration and Management Projects.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 33, § 124-A, additional.** Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 124-A, to read as follows:

**'Fish Restoration and Management**

**Sec. 124-A.** Assenting to the provisions of the Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide that the United States shall aid the States in fish restoration and management projects, and for other purposes." The state of Maine hereby assents to the provisions of the act of Congress entitled "An act to provide that the United States shall aid the States in fish restoration and management projects, and for other purposes," approved August 9, 1950 (Public Law 681, 81st Congress), and the department of inland fisheries and game is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to perform such acts as may be necessary to the conduct and establishment of cooperative fish restoration projects, as defined in said act of Congress, in compliance with said act and rules and regulations promulgated by the secre-

tary of the interior thereunder; and no funds accruing to the state of Maine from license fees paid by fishermen shall be diverted for any other purpose than the administration of the department and for the protection, propagation, preservation and investigation of fish and game.'
