STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT to Change the Law Relating to Apothecaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 62, § 8, amended. The 1st sentence of section 8 of chapter 62 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Every registered pharmacist and every qualified assistant who desires to continue to practice pharmacy in this state shall annually, after the expiration of the first year of his registration, on or before the last day of December June, pay a renewal fee of \$2 to the secretary of the board, in return for which a renewal registration shall be issued.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 62, § 9, amended. The next to the last paragraph of section 9 of chapter 62 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Permits issued under the provisions of this section shall be exposed in a conspicuous place in the apothecary store for which issued. Such permit shall not be transferable, shall expire the last day of December June following the date of issue, and shall be renewed annually.'

Sec. 3. Extension. Registrations issued for the calendar year of 1951 shall remain valid until June 30, 1952.
