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### AN ACT Relating to Licenses for Consumption Sale.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., c. 57, § 1, amended.** The 9th paragraph of section 1 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 226 of the public laws of 1947, and amended by section 96 of chapter 349 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'No additional requirements imposed by the provisions of this section shall affect premises licensed on August 13, 1947, and nothing in this section shall be held to prevent the commission from issuing summer or part-time licenses to bona fide summer hotels where accommodations and meals are not provided under one roof, provided that such hotel can in no way be classed as over-night camps, ~~and provided further, that no liquor shall be served or delivered by the licensee, his servants or agents to guests in rooms outside of the main building~~ and provided further, that liquor in the original package may be served or delivered by the licensee, his servants or agents to guests in rooms or cottages outside of the main building.'

**Sec. 2. R. S., c. 57, § 40, amended.** The 1st paragraph of section 40 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

**‘, and part-time licensees operating bona fide summer hotels may sell, furnish and deliver liquor for consumption on the licensed premises at such places on the hotel premises, outside of the main building, as may have been designated in their applications and approved by the commission.’**
