**RESOLVE, to Make Lawful the Fishing for Cusk in Long Lake and
Sebago Lake, Cumberland County.**

Fishing for cusk in Long lake and Sebago lake, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation providing that it shall be lawful to fish for cusk by unattended set lines through the ice at night between the hours of 4 P. M. and 8 A. M. in Long lake in the towns of Naples, Bridgton and Harrison, and in Sebago lake, Cumberland county; the hooks of said lines to be not over 12 inches from the bottom of the lake.
