STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Local Option in Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, §, amended. That part of section 2 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as amended, which precedes subsection V is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Upon receipt of a petition of electors resident in that city or town in writing addressed to the secretary of state and signed by at least 15% of the number of voters voting for the gubernatorial candidates at the last state-wide election in that city or town, which petition shall be filed with the secretary of state on or before the 1st day of July preceding the day of the biennial election, the ballots for that city or town shall carry in accordance with the petition any or all of the following questions:

I. Shall state stores for the sale of liquor be operated by permission of the state liquor commission in this city or town?

II. Shall licenses be granted in this city or town for the sale herein of wine and spirits to be consumed on the premises?

III. Shall licenses be granted in this city or town for the sale herein of malt liquor (beer, ale and other malt liquors) to be consumed on the premises?

III-A. Shall licenses be granted in this city or town for the sale therein of malt liquor (beer, ale and other malt liquors) to be consumed on the premises of taverns?

IV. Shall licenses be granted in this city or town for the sale herein of malt liquor (beer, ale and other malt liquors) not to be consumed on the premises?'

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
