STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Penalties for Violation of Outdoor Advertising Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 20, § 122, amended. Section 122 of chapter 20 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 122. Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation who shall erect, maintain or display an advertisement, sign or billboard, or any structure designed for the display of advertising matter contrary to the provisions of sections III to 122, inclusive, shall forfeit and pay be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$100 for each sign so displayed, to be recovered by action at law in the name and for the use of the state to be expended as provided in section III. The display of each sign shall constitute a separate offense. The fines and costs imposed and collected under the provisions of this section shall be paid to the treasurer of state and deposited in accordance with the provisions of section III.'
