STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Create the Maine State Safety Council.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 26-A, additional. The revised statutes are hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to be designated chapter 26-A, to read as follows:

'CHAPTER 26-A.

MAINE STATE SAFETY COUNCIL.

Sec. 1. State safety council. The secretary of state, the chief of the state police, the attorney general, the commissioner of education, the insurance commissioner, the commissioner of labor and industry and the state highway commissioners shall constitute a board to be known as the Maine State Safety Council, hereinafter referred to as the "council." The governor shall also be a chairman ex officio of said council. The members of this board shall not receive any compensation for their services as such members except their expenses. The members of said council are authorized to appoint an executive secretary whose compensation shall be fixed at \$5,000 per year. The members of the council shall meet once a month and elect an acting chairman from within the council itself.

Sec. 2. Powers and duties of the council. The Maine state safety council shall coordinate and promote safety projects and serve as a clearing house for all safety work within the state.'
