RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Alice B. Grant, of Kittery.

Teacher's pension granted to Alice B. Grant. Resolved: That Alice B. Grant, of Kittery, be given credit for 6 years of teaching service at the U. S. Navy Yard so that she may be entitled to a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Grant taught in the public schools of Maine for 20 years. At the U. S. Navy Yard, she taught the officers' children during the following years: September 1907 to June 1909; September 1914 to June 1915; September 1916 to June 1919. She is asking credit for the 6 years taught at the U. S. Navy Yard. Her last 13 years of teaching was in the Kittery public schools. In 1935, all married teachers were not rehired and she was forced to end her work as a teacher. Later on, when married teachers were again hired in Kittery, she was unable to resume teaching because of ill health.
