AN ACT Relating to Definition of Tavern in Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 1, amended. The 14th paragraph of section 1 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 322 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Tavern” shall mean a reputable place for men only operated by responsible persons where no food is sold **except confectionery** and no business is carried on except the sale of malt liquor at a bar **and except the sale of tobacco products**. There shall be no table, chairs or other seating accommodations and all persons served shall remain standing at the bar.’
