AN ACT Relating to Definition of "Teacher" Under Maine State
Retirement Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 60, § 1, amended. The 5th paragraph of section 1 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes, as revised by section 3 of chapter 384 of the public laws of 1947 and amended by chapter 428 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

“Teacher” shall mean any teacher, principal, supervisor, school nurse, school secretary or superintendent employed in any day school within the state, including teachers in unorganized territory and teachers who teach in any day school which is receiving or has received any direct state aid since 1920.’
