STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Prohibiting Employment of Females by Certain Liquor Licensees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 38-A, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 38-A of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 89 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No licensee for the sale of liquor to be consumed on licensed premises shall employ any person under the age of 21 years **nor a female employee** in the direct handling, ~~or~~ **selling or serving** of liquor on the premises where such liquor is sold **except that the wife of the licensee if she is of the age of 21 years or over or a female licensee may be employed in the direct handling, selling or serving of liquor.**'
