STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Hours of Business of Retail Stores Selling Malt Beverages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 23, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 23 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by chapter 216 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new sentence to read as follows:

'No such licensee for the sale and distribution of malt liquor in retail stores shall engage in retail business of any kind nor shall he keep his store open for business on the Lord's Day or after 8 P. M. in the evening on any other day of the week; and the violation of this provision shall be punished by forfeiture of the license of such licensee.'
