STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Lobster Meat.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 120, amended. The 1st and 4th paragraphs of section 120 of chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person shall remove lobster meat from the shell for sale without a permit therefor, nor shall any person sell, offer or expose for sale, give away, ship or transport or have in his possession any lobster meat after the same has been removed from the shell except as herein provided.'

'It shall be unlawful to sell, offer for sale, deliver, ship or transport or have in his possession any tail section of lobster meat that is not whole and intact as removed from the shell, except that hotels and restaurants may cut up such lobster meat immediately prior to and for the purpose of serving it to customers on the premises, and except further that any person may cut up such lobster meat immediately prior to and for the purpose of canning.'
