STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Motor Vehicles Following Fire Apparatus and Crossing Fire Hose.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, §§ 109-A and 109-B, additional. Chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto 2 new sections to be numbered 109-A and 109-B, to read as follows:

'Sec. 109-A. Following fire apparatus prohibited. The driver of any motor vehicle, other than one on official business, shall not follow any fire apparatus traveling in response to a fire alarm closer than 500 feet nor drive into or park such vehicle within the street where fire apparatus has stopped to answer to a fire alarm.

Sec. 109-B. Driving over fire hose regulated. No street car or motor vehicle shall be driven over any unprotected hose of a fire department when laid down on any street, private driveway or street car track, to be used at any fire or alarm of fire, without the consent of the fire department official in command.'
