IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

**AN ACT to Ratify the Organization of Calvinistic Baptist Church and
Society in Eastport and to Change Its Corporate Name.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Organization ratified. The organization of Calvinistic Baptist Church and Society in Eastport on August 28, 1821, under the provisions of chapter CXXXV of the public laws of 1821 is hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Sec. 2. Corporate acts ratified. All corporate acts and proceedings of the Calvinistic Baptist Church and Society in Eastport taken prior to the effective date of this act, including the vote adopted January 11, 1949 to change the name of the corporation to Washington Street Baptist Church, Incorporated, in Eastport, Maine, are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Sec. 3. Gifts valid. Any and all gifts, grants and conveyances to or from Calvinistic Baptist Church and Society in Eastport after August 28, 1821 and prior to January 11, 1949, and any and all gifts, grants and conveyances to or from Washington Street Baptist Church, Incorporated, in Eastport, Maine, between the latter date and the time when this act be-

comes effective are hereby declared valid and effective insofar as their validity depends upon corporate action taken on behalf of the corporation aforesaid.
