STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Salaries of the Judge and the Recorder of the Old Town Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 153, § 9, amended. The last sentence of section 9 of chapter 153 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended by chapter 92 of the private and special laws of 1949, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'The salary of the judge of said court shall be \$7,800 \$2,100, annually; that of the recorder, \$7,200 \$1,500, annually, and both of said salaries are to be paid quarterly monthly, with and all other expenses of said court are to be paid quarterly from the treasury of the county of Penobscot, and such additional amount for clerk hire as may be authorized by the county commissioners.'
