**AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the City of Waterville to Provide
Compensation for Municipal Officers, Board of Aldermen and City
Council.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1887, c. 195, § 17, amended. Section 17 of chapter 195 of the private and special laws of 1887 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 17. Aldermen, councilmen and municipal officers; compensation. Each duly elected member of the board of aldermen and common council shall be paid the sum of \$5 for each regular and special meeting of the city government that he shall attend, and each of the municipal officers shall be paid the sum of \$5 for each special meeting of the municipal officers that he shall attend; but only 1 fee of \$5 shall be payable in the event that the date of the meeting of the municipal officers coincides with the date of the meeting of the city government. The aldermen and common councilmen shall not be entitled to receive any ~~salary or~~ other compensation during the year for which they are elected, nor be eligible to any office of profit or emolument, the salary of which is payable by the city, and all departments, boards, officers and committees, acting under the authority of the city and entrusted with the expenditure of public money, shall expend the

same for no other purpose than that for which it is appropriated, and shall be accountable therefor to the city in such manner as the city council may direct.'
