STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Indians at Pleasant Point Reservation for Building and Repair of Homes.

Indians at Pleasant Point Reservation; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the state the sum of \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1952, and the sum of \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1953, to be expended for the purpose of repairing existing homes and building new homes for the Indians of Pleasant Point Reservation; these funds to be expended on authorization of the department of health and welfare.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Passamaquoddy Tribe, through its representatives, has requested that consideration be given to resolve making funds available for repairing existing homes and building of new homes. From time to time minor repairs have been financed from the appropriation of the Passamaquoddy Tribe in those cases where it seemed necessary to repair homes for Indians receiving relief.
