AN ACT to Designate Certain Waters of the Dead River as Flagstaff Lake.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Certain waters designated as Flagstaff lake. From and after the effective date of this act, all waters of the Dead river, including the North and South branch thereof and Flagstaff pond, which are located in township 3, range 4, township 2, range 3 (known as Carrying Place Town), Dead River plantation, Flagstaff plantation and Bigelow plantation, all in the county of Somerset, and the town of Eustis in the county of Franklin, within the limits of the storage reservoir created by the Long Falls Dam, so called, shall be called and known by the name of Flagstaff lake.
