STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating the Taking of Marine Worms.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 129, amended. Section 129 of chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding after the 2nd paragraph thereof, 2 new paragraphs to read as follows:

'It shall be lawful for any person, firm or corporation, who legally possesses such a marine worm license, to dig, take, buy or sell marine worms, clam-worms, blood-worms and sand-worms in any tidewater area of the state, except those areas which are closed to all digging for the conservation of marine worms by the department.

No area shall be closed for the purpose of conservation to the digging or taking of marine worms, clam-worms, blood-worms and sand-worms except as provided in section 5 of this chapter.'
