IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

MEMORIAL

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, petitioning for amendments to the federal wage and hour regulations relating to part-time home workers in the needlecraft industry.

We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in the 95th Legislative Session assembled, most respectfully present and petition your Honorable Body as follows:

Whereas, there is a substantial number of women home workers in Maine, each earnestly desirous of the modest income they might receive from part-time home work in the needlecraft employment; and

Whereas, the application of current federal wage and hour regulations makes economically impossible the employment of these home workers; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Congress take such action as shall amend such provision of federal law or direct such amendments to the administrative procedures as to make possible the reemployment of these deserving Maine citizens; and be it further

Resolved: That a copy of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary of the Senate, be immediately transmitted by the Secretary of State, by registered mail, to each of the Representatives and Senators representing the State of Maine in the United States Congress.
