IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Gambling.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 126, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 126 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Pool selling, book making and numbers game; penalty. Whoever engages or participates in pool selling, **book making and numbers game**, or aids or abets the same by his presence, unless the same is authorized by law, or **whoever, owning or controlling any place of business where in such activities or any part thereof are taking place, knowingly permits the same**, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$2,000 and by imprisonment for not more than 2 years.'
