STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Pension for Members of the Police Department of City of Auburn.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1917, c. 201, Art. VI-A, § 4 amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 4 of article VI-A of chapter 201 of the private and special laws of 1917, as enacted by chapter 89 of the private and special laws of 1941, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- '2. When any regular member of the said police department, including the department chief, shall have arrived at the age of 60 years or shall have served 25 years in said department, he may petition for the benefits of this article, and his honorable discharge shall be given him by the city council upon receipt of a proper certificate from said pension commission whereupon he shall automatically become eligible for all benefits of said pension.'
