### STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating the Digging of Marine Worms in the Town of Stockton Springs, Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Digging of marine worms in town of Stockton Springs, regulated; penalty. It shall be unlawful for any person to dig any marine worms within the limits of the town of Stockton Springs, in the county of Waldo, without first having obtained a license therefor from the municipal officers of said town of Stockton Springs, who are hereby authorized to grant and issue such licenses and fix the fee therefor. No license shall be issued to any person except a resident of said town or a person who is assessed and pays a real estate tax therein. For the purposes of this chapter, the term "a resident" shall mean a person who has resided in this state for the term of at least 6 consecutive months and in the town of Stockton Springs for at least 3 months immediately prior to the date when a claim of such residence is made.

Whoever digs clams in violation of the provisions of this chapter shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
