STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Lease Privileges for Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 351, amended. Section 351 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 351. Agents may lease privileges for mills, booms and fisheries. The agent may, with the approval of the department governor and council of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, lease any reserved privileges for mills, booms and fisheries for a term sufficiently long to induce persons to take leases of them; and all rents shall be paid into the tribal treasury, to be expended for the benefit of the tribe, under the direction of the department governor and council of the tribe.'
