STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, Providing for State Pension for Elwin Verdon, of Fairfield.

Elwin Verdon; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$40 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Elwin Verdon, of Fairfield, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1951, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

This pension shall be paid to Charlotte Harris to be expended by her for the care and support of her brother.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Elwin Verdon, aged 40, lives with his sister, Charlotte Harris, 13 West Street, Fairfield, who is his guardian. He is simple-minded and has no means of support. His sister has 4 children, 3 of whom are at home, so she is unable to help him much financially.
