# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Including Members and Clerks of Boards of Registration in Maine State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 60, § 1, amended. The 4th paragraph of section 1 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Employee" shall mean any regular classified or unclassified officer or employee in a department, including teachers in the state teachers' colleges, normal schools and Madawaska training school, and for the purposes of this chapter, teachers in the public schools, but shall not include any member of the state legislature or the council or any judge of the superior court or supreme judicial court who is now or may be later entitled to retirement benefits under the provisions of section 5 of chapter 91 and section 3 of chapter 94, nor shall it include any member of the state police who is now entitled to retirement benefits under the provisions of sections 21 and 22 of chapter 13. Employee shall also include members and clerks of boards of registration as defined in chapter 3. In all cases of doubt the board of trustees shall determine whether any person is an employee as defined in this chapter.'
