STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Special Deputy Sheriffs in Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 189, amended. Section 189 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 189. Special deputies in Cumberland county; compensation. The sheriff of Cumberland county shall appoint 3 4 full-time deputy sheriffs, who shall serve at the pleasure of said sheriff, and whose special duty shall be to enforce the criminal laws in said county, and who shall receive as compensation therefor the sum of \$7 per day to be paid from the county treasury, together with such incidental expenses as may be necessary for the proper enforcement of said laws; bills for which shall be audited as provided in section 2 of chapter 137. Such full-time deputies shall have their headquarters in the following towns in Cumberland county: 2 in Portland, 1 in Brunswick and 1 in Bridgton.'
