STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Exemption of Parsonages from Taxation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 81, § 6, sub-§ V, amended. Subsection V of section 6 of chapter 81 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘**V.** Houses of religious worship, including vestries, and the pews and furniture within the same, except for parochial purposes; tombs and rights of burial; and property ~~held owned and used~~ by a religious society as a parsonage ~~not exceeding \$6,000 in value, and from which no rent is received to the value of \$6,000,~~ and personal property not exceeding \$6,000 in value; but all other property of any religious society, both real and personal, and so much of any parsonage as is rented, is liable to taxation the same as other property.’
