IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Secondary School Tuition.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 37, § 98, amended. The 1st sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 98 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 1 of chapter 443 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘In the case of any youth attending school under conditions as provided for in the preceding paragraph, the annual tuition shall not exceed 100% of the average cost per pupil in all secondary schools of the state for the preceding year.’

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 37, § 99, amended. The 2nd and 3rd sentences of section 99 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as amended, are hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘Tuition for each pupil may be paid by towns to an amount not exceeding the receiving school’s average cost per pupil for the year preceding that for which the tuition is paid; except that payments in excess of said average cost may be made by vote of the sending town, but such payment by a town for any pupil for any 1 year shall be subject to the provisions of section 98.’
