STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Location of Public Utility Structures.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 46, § 17-A, additional. Chapter 46 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 17-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 17-A. Validity clause. The location of all pipes, hydrants, wires and cables and all conduits and other structures for the conducting and maintaining of such pipes, hydrants, wires and cables under the surface and in those streets and highways in which the above such companies are empowered to obtain locations for their pipes, wires, hydrants and cables which have been located under the surface and in the streets and highways, are hereby valid and declared legal and the same shall henceforth be legal structures in said streets and highways until the location thereof shall have been changed in any manner required or authorized by law.'
