STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Support of Paupers by Kindred.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 82, § 20, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 20 of chapter 82 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'A town or any kindred of a pauper having incurred expense for the relief of such pauper may complain to the superior court in the county where any of the kindred reside; and the court may cause such kindred to be summoned, and upon hearing or default may assess and apportion a reasonable sum upon such as are found to be of sufficient ability for the support of such pauper to the time of such assessment; and may enforce payment thereof by warrant of distress and shall issue a writ of execution.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 82, § 20, amended. The 3rd sentence from the end of section 20 of chapter 82 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'On application of the town or person to whom payment was ordered, the clerk may issue or renew a warrant or distress writ of execution returnable to the next term of the court to collect what may be due for any preceding quarter.'
