AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in the Town of Wells.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 34, § 75-A, additional.** Chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 75-A, to read as follows:

**'Sec. 75-A. Digging of clams in the town of Wells; penalty.** It shall be unlawful for non-residents of the town of Wells, in the county of York, to dig during 1 day more than 1 peck of clams within the limits of said town. It shall be unlawful for the non-residents of said town to dig any clams for any use whatsoever, except home consumption; provided that this law shall not supercede any law relating to the taking by fishermen of shellfish for bait.

It shall be unlawful for any person to dig clams within said town other than with a clam hoe.

Whoever violates any of the provisions hereof shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.'
