STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Trespass on Airports.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 21, § 15, sub-§ I, ¶ J, additional. Subsection I of section 15 of chapter 21 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by chapter 389 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph to be lettered J, to read as follows:

‘J. for any person to trespass upon the landing area of any licensed airport.’

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 21, § 15, sub-§ II, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection II of section 15 of chapter 21 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by chapter 389 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘A. any person who violates any provisions of this chapter pertaining to registration, **trespass** or the air traffic rules, or who violates any provisions of an order, rule or regulation made hereunder, or fails to answer a subpoena or to testify before the commission shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200 or by imprisonment for not more than 3 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment;’
