STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing Licenses for Boys' and Girls' Camps.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 33-A, additional. Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 33-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 33-A. Licenses for boys' and girls' camps. Upon application the commissioner shall issue to a boys' camp or girls' camp a camp fishing license which will permit any 4 councillors designated by such camp to fish with any or all of the boys or girls in such camp. Such boys and girls may fish without obtaining any other licenses. The fee for a boys' camp shall be \$75 and the fee for a girls' camp shall be \$50. Those persons who fish under a camp fishing license as provided by this section shall be subject to all of the laws, rules and regulations of this chapter.'
