# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

### AN ACT Relating to Wearing Certain Insignia While Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 33, § 63-A, additional.** Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 63-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 63-A. Certain insignia to be worn. The commissioner of inland fisheries and game shall furnish each person who obtains a hunting license upon the additional payment of a fee of 25c with a strip of red cloth with the following words in yellow upon such cloth: IS IT A DEER OR A MAN? The commissioner shall determine the size of the cloth and the letters.

Such cloth shall be fastened by the person obtaining the hunting license to the cuff of the sleeve on the arm which is extended to hold the barrel of a gun. It shall be fastened on the inner side of the sleeve toward the top so that it will be visible to the person wearing it while hunting.

Any person hunting without wearing the strip of cloth as provided by this section shall be punished under the provisions of section 119.'
