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**AN ACT to Place a Bounty on Porcupines.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 27, § 2-A, additional.** Chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 2-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 2-A. Bounty provided. A bounty of 25c is hereby placed on porcupines killed. Such bounty shall be paid by town treasurers on delivery to him of the porcupine's nose. The commisioner of agriculture is hereby directed to reimburse the town treasurer on satisfactory evidence that the bounty has been paid.'
