STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Municipal Courts Without Judge or Recorder.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 96, § 3-A, additional. Chapter 96 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 3-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 3-A. Municipal courts without judge or recorder. In the event that any municipal court shall be without the services of its judge or recorder, for any cause, any municipal court judge or recorder, within the same county, may on request of the county attorney preside in said municipal court and shall have all the powers and privileges granted to the judge and recorder in said municipal court while he shall so preside therein.'
