STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Town Ordinances for Junk Yards.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 80, § 83, sub-§ XX, additional. Section 83 of chapter 80 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered XX, to read as follows:
 - 'XX. To entertain applications for the establishment of junk yards, give notice thereof, hold hearings thereon, issue licenses or permits therefor, subject to such reasonable restrictions, conditions and limitations as may seem desirable; to fix the costs and fees that shall be paid by applicants for notice, hearing and license; to provide suitable penalties for violations; and the fees, charges and penalties prescribed in sections 108, 110 and 112 of chapter 88 shall be permissible and shall be deemed reasonable.'
