STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating the Dragging for Scallops in Harrington River and Pleasant River, Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 108-A, additional. Chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 108-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 108-A. Dragging for scallops in Harrington river and Pleasant river, Washington county; penalty. No person shall drag for scallops in Harrington river and Pleasant river, Washington county, with more than one drag. Such drag shall be not more than 4 feet long and of dragging width.

Such dragging shall be limited to:

Harrington river: Inside of a line drawn from the north end of Strout's island to the south end of Foster's island.

Pleasant river: Inside of a line drawn from the south end of Guard point to the south end of Gibbs' island.

Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of \$50.'
