STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT to Authorize Cities and Towns to Accept Grants from Federal Government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 80, § 105-A, additional. Chapter 80 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 105-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 105-A. Towns may receive grants from federal government. The respective cities and towns of the state of Maine are given full authority, power and legal capacity to accept title to lands and buildings from the United States of America or any agency thereof, and are authorized and empowered to pay to the United States of America, or any of its agents, a sum equal to the cost of acquisition of said lands and buildings of the United States of America.'
