# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

# AN ACT Relating to Installations in Public Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 20, § 67-A, amended. Section 67-A of chapter 20 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 384 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 67-A. Installations in state or state aid highways forbidden; penalty. No person shall install, erect or construct, or cause to be installed, erected or constructed any such installations as buildings er, gasoline pumps or other fixtures in or upon any state or state aid highway or within 33 feet of the center line of said highway; and such state or state aid highway shall be deemed the full width of the right of way as laid out by the state, the county or the town. This paragraph shall not apply to the installations or other property devoted to the public use of any public utility or district or to the installations or other property now in existence.

Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5, nor more than \$500, and whoever after conviction of such violation unlawfully maintains any such installations as buildings or gasoline pumps or other fixtures for 30 days after

such conviction may be punished by a further fine of not more than \$50 for each day upon which such installations as buildings or, gasoline pumps or other fixtures are maintained.'
