AN ACT Relative to the Dismissal of Conservators.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 145, § 9, amended. Section 9 of chapter 145 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'The judge of probate may dismiss any conservator when it appears necessary, or at his own request, or when the judge shall find that the person under conservatorship has become capable of managing his own estate with prudence and understanding. If the case requires it, the judge may appoint another conservator in place of the former one. But previous to such removal, except at his own request, personal notice shall be given to the conservator, or public notice if his residence is out of the state or unknown, to appear and show cause to the contrary.'
