STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting of Foxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 33, § 97, sub-§ VII, amended. Subsection VII of section 97 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 'VII. For a period of 2 years from August 13, 1949 1951, it shall be lawful to dig out foxes at any time and to hunt foxes at any time, except Sunday and in the night-time, in organized territory in this state. It shall be lawful to trap foxes or to cause to have foxes trapped, at any time, on one's own land, within a distance of 100 yards from a shelter or range where poultry is raised or kept.'
