STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Re-Establishing Prohibition for the Duration of the Emergency.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 57, § 97-A, additional. Chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 97-A, to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 97-A. Liquor laws suspended. The provisions of this chapter which relate to the legal sale of liquor shall be suspended.'
- Sec. 2. Intent and duration. It is the intent of the legislature to suspend the legal sale of liquor in this state and to reestablish prohibition until 6 months after the state of war, whether declared or undeclared, ceases between the United States and every foreign country, at which time the present laws relating to the legal sale of liquor shall return to full force and effect.
