SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1665, L. D. 1235, Bill "An Act
Relating to the Sale of Lobster Meat."

Amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof the following
underlined paragraph:

"No specie of shellfish, either in a canned, frozen or fresh
state, with the meat removed from the shell or otherwise shall be
sold, served in public eating places, labeled or advertised as
lobster or imitation lobster in the state of Maine, except the
specie of lobster commonly known as Americanus Homarus."
